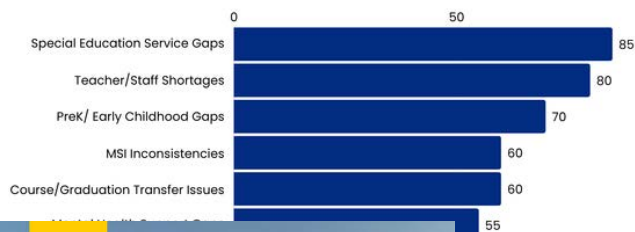

2025 Status of Education

This report consolidates national educational challenges faced by military-connected students across the DAF School Liaison enterprise. These trends reflect systemic cases and inquiries impacting readiness, and educational continuity for military-connected communities.

FY25 PSMI FACILITIES ASSESSMENT



In January 2026, ALPHA Facilities Solutions will begin an assessment of local education agency facilities that are located on military installations. DoDEA is assessing 100+ public schools operated on military installations to update their priority list of facility/capacity issues for Congressional funding consideration. The previous assessment (accomplished in 2018) resulted in \$1.861B of additional funding which went to 71 schools with highest need. The DoD Office of Local Defense Community Cooperation (OLDCC) has successfully managed a grant program using the prioritization of schools assessed with serious condition and capacity deficiencies.

The SLP is the primary installation POC for all PSMI matters, to include this required assessment, IAW the FY2025 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) Title XXVIII, Subtitle E, Sec. 2878.

Turning Stories into Insights

Using Anecdotal Data to Drive Change

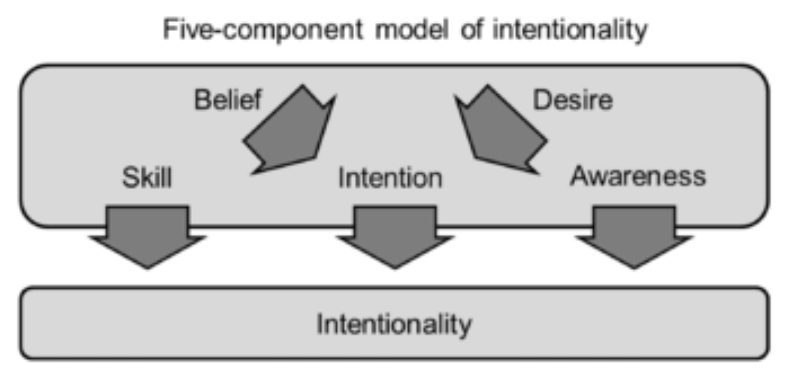


Military-connected communities encounter distinct challenges, and as School Liaisons, we are positioned at the forefront of navigating these experiences firsthand. Anecdotal evidence, informal case studies, inquiries, observations, and personal narratives serve as valuable tools in understanding and addressing these issues effectively.

Data Tells – Stories Sell

While numerical data is invaluable, it cannot fully encapsulate the complexities of a military-connected student's journey. When these narratives are collected and analyzed comprehensively, they can inform targeted strategies, shape effective policies, and ultimately enhance educational outcomes.

- ✔ **Track total cases and inquiries:** Record the number of cases/inquiries handled over a specific time
- ✔ **Categorize by Type of Case/Inquiry:** Group cases by type (Example 50% of inquiries and cases were related to homeschool navigation)
- ✔ **Document Outcomes:** Record both resolved and unresolved cases, along with specific results achieved. For instance, 75% of cases resulted in a resolution within the local education agency
- ✔ **Measure Frequency:** Monitor recurring inquiries and cases to identify persistent needs or emerging trends



When used strategically, School Liaisons convert individual stories into trend data that informs command decisions, prioritizes resources, and reduces education-related readiness risk, keeping programs aligned to today's families and tomorrow's force.

Schriever SFB and Peterson SFB SLPMs hosted an Educators STEM Professional Development Day focused on 3D printing. The training provided a comprehensive overview to 25 educators on 3D printer capabilities, including building, classroom integration, safety protocols and opportunities to further skill development through follow-up sessions. Through partnership with Challenger Learning Center, educators will have ongoing support as they utilize this resource in their teaching. At the conclusion of the event, each educator left with a fully operational 3D printer and both Schriever SFB and Peterson SFB SLPMs secured 3D printers for their lending libraries for educators and homeschool families, expanding access to innovative technology across their communities.

The International School of Stavanger recently hosted a parent event featuring Dr. Nadine Kolb from the Universitetet i Stavanger, who presented her research on supporting multilingual language development. Dr. Kolb emphasizes the critical role of parent involvement in successful language acquisition, highlighting developmental stages, strategies for navigating diverse language environments across home, school, and social settings and approaches for children with

learning differences. Her central message underscored that the introduction of additional languages is a gift and with engaged parents, children are positioned to thrive linguistically and academically.

Public Schools on Military Installations (PSMI)

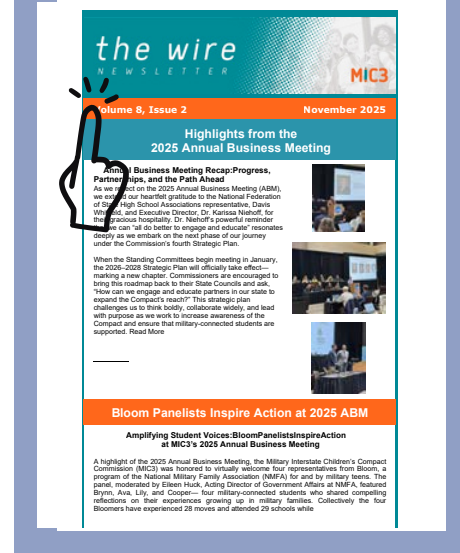
The DOW's Office of Local Defense and Community Cooperation has awarded **Grand Forks AFB** Public School District No. 140 a \$55.2M grant to help fund construction for a new Nathan F. Twining Elementary and Middle School. Once completed, the new campus will serve 500 PreK-8th grade students, enhancing educational quality for military-connected students. The awarding of this grant supports military readiness, strengthens recruitment and retention and fosters resilience among the community.

Military Family Life Counselors (MFLCs)

The top child and youth behavioral non-medical counseling issues identified for 2025 encompassed **social skills, emotional management, communication and transition issues**.
